

North Sea Blanket

Designed by

High Desert Yarn

This beginner-friendly crochet blanket pattern uses super bulky yarn to create a thick, cozy blanket. No complicated stitches—just a simple, relaxing project for new (or seasoned) crocheters.



Materials

Yarn – Super Bulky (category 6) weight yarn

- I used Bernat Blanket Yarn in North Sea (100% polyester, 300g/220yds)
- You need approximately 775 – 2,575 yds depending on size.

Crochet Hook – 9.00mm, or hook to meet gauge

Notions – Tapestry Needle, Scissors

Notes

- **Experience Level - Beginner**
 - You will need to know how to create a Single Crochet, Half Double Crochet, and Double Crochet Stitch.
- CH 1 and CH 2 do not count as stitches.
- This pattern is worked in turning rows, and consists of a 3-Row Repeat.
- Stitch counts and sizes for this pattern are written as follows: A (B, C, D)
 - Please see the “Finished Size” section for sizes and corresponding letters.
 - Tip : Print out this pattern to circle/highlight your size and stitch counts throughout this pattern. This helps me avoid mix ups as I work a pattern written in multiple sizes!
- Advanced Beginners – You may substitute the ch 2 on Row 3 for a Standing Double Crochet.
- Odd numbered rows are the Right Side of the blanket.

Finished Size

Size is measured before blocking.

A. Receiving (Baby) – 36" x 36"

- You will need approximately 775yds of yarn.

B. Lapghan – 36" x 48"

- You will need approximately 1,030yds of yarn.

C. Throw – 52" x 60"

- You will need approximately 1,860yds of yarn.

D. XL Throw – 60" x 72"

- You will need approximately 2,575yds of yarn.



Gauge

- 8 sts x 5 rows = 4x4" worked in the pattern repeat.
- Gauge is measured without blocking.

Stitch Abbreviations

US crochet terms used throughout.

- CH(s) – chain(s)
- SC – single crochet
- HDC – half double crochet
- DC – double crochet
- ST(S) – stitch(es)

Special Stitches

Single Crochet (SC)

Insert your hook into the next stitch. Yarn over and pull up a loop. There are two loops on the hook. Yarn over and pull through both loops. The Single Crochet Stitch is complete.

Half Double Crochet (HDC)

Yarn over and insert your hook into next stitch. Yarn over and pull up one loop. There are three loops on the hook. Yarn over and pull through all loops. The Half Double Crochet Stitch is complete.

Double Crochet (DC)

Yarn over and insert hook into next stitch. Yarn over and pull up one loop. There are three loops on the hook. Yarn over and pull through two loops. There are two loops on the hook. Yarn over and pull through all loops. The Double Crochet Stitch is complete.

Written Instructions

Chain 74 (74, 106, 122)

Row 1: In 3rd ch from hook, DC, DC in each ch across, ch 1, turn. [72 (72, 104, 120) sts]

Row 2: HDC in each st across, ch 1, turn. [72 (72, 104, 120) sts]

Row 3: SC in each st across, ch 2, turn. [72 (72, 104, 120) sts]

Row 4: DC in each st across, ch 1, turn. [72 (72, 104, 120) sts]

Repeat Rows 2-4 until your blanket reaches 46 (61, 76, 91) rows. The last row of your blanket will be a DC row. Cut your yarn, fasten off, and weave in any remaining ends. Congrats! You've just made a beautiful new blanket. Enjoy, friend!
